



Press the Button

was born out of Leung Chi Wo's eponymous solo exhibition at OCAT Shenzhen in 2015. After the exhibition, Leung created hand drawings for each of the works it showcased. The new book features 54 pen drawings, along with textual descriptions of the exhibited works. Laid out in the standard format of exhibition captions, the textual descriptions of the exhibited works are used to clarify the intention, concepts and techniques behind their creation.

Accompanying these descriptions are images and text the artist drew on A4 paper with a black outliner pen, which call to mind prefaces and postscripts to ancient Chinese paintings. Originally fashioned by art dealers and collectors in the Yuan Dynasty, the practice of leaving postscripts on paintings gradually evolved into an artistic tactic that is sometimes employed by artists to help illustrate their original works, and that at other times consists of self-initiated creative writing or poems by commentators inspired by the works. In Press the Button, these inscriptions command a life of their own.




《請按鈕: 瞻前顧後.....》




伴隨作品說明的是藝術家用黑色勾線筆在 A4 紙上逐一繪 畫的圖像和手寫的文字。這些圖像和文字讓人聯想到中 國古代書畫中的題跋, 這種從元代開始, 經手者和收藏 家在畫上題書詩文的行為不單漸演變成對原作解說的策 略,它亦是題跋者受作品啟發而借題發揮創作的文章和 詩詞——如《請按鈕: 瞻前顧後……》中的「題跋」自 成一體。
