

Antonio MAK Hin-Yeung

Born in the Philippines and moved to Hong Kong when he was one month old, Antonio Mak Hin-Yeung (1951-1994) was one of the most prominent figures belonging to an exciting, pioneering generation of Hong Kong young artists who challenged the art establishment and created a new and unprecedented alternative art scene in the 1980s. Through sculpture-making, especially using the bronze casting technique, painting, and drawing, he experimented with icons, symbolism, and homonymic word plays in his works, which contemplates on the complexities of human existence and meditated on the socio-political climate of colonial Hong Kong.

Mak studied painting at Goldsmith's College, University of London in 1971-1975. From 1975-77, Mak undertook studies in sculptures at the Slade School of Art, University of London and worked under supervision at the Bronze Foundry of The Royal College of Art in London. He also won the UK Delegacy Prize in 1975. In the late 1980s, Mak travelled to US for intensive training in the latest technical methodologies of bronze casting at the Johnson Foundry in New York.

From 1975 to 1994, Mak held six solo exhibitions in Hong Kong and UK and participated in various group exhibitions in UK, China, Taiwan and Hong Kong. He also participated in the seminal self-organized group exhibition, "Out of Context" (1987), an important chapter in the history of Hong Kong contemporary art. After his premature passing, his retrospectives held in institutions and museums include "Looking for Antonio Mak" (Hong Kong Museum of Art, 2008) and "The Art of Antonio Mak – A Retrospective" (Hong Kong Arts Centre, 1995).

Championed new modes of artistic debate and display, Mak was a core instigator of the Rooftop Studio and the Out of Context project, which were important forerunners of new art spaces including E-Zone and Quart Society in the late 1980s and early 1990s. In spite of their very ephemeral nature, all of these activities laid the groundwork for the independent art space movement in Hong Kong in the 1990s.
