Blindspot Gallery is pleased to return to Art Basel Hong Kong 2025 (Booth 1D29), presenting works by Chen Wei, Un Cheng, Chihoi, Isaac Chong Wai, South Ho Siu Nam, Pixy Liao, Jen Liu, Sin Wai Kin, So Wing Po, Angela Su, Xiyadie, Yooyun Yang, Yeung Tong Lung, Trevor Yeung, Zhang Wenzhi, and Zheng Haozhong. During Art Basel, Blindspot Gallery will be presenting Chen Wei and Sin Wai Kin's solo exhibitions at the gallery: "Chen Wei: Breath of Silence" is on view from 18 February to 12 April 2025, and "Sin Wai Kin: The Time of Our Lives" is on show from 24 March to 10 May 2025. Coinciding with Art Basel, Sin's new video commission will be

presented at M+ in "The Hong Kong Jockey Club Series: Picasso for Asia—A Conversation", opening on 15 March 2025; So Wing Po's solo exhibition "Take Turns" will also be showcased at Para Site from 15 March, 2025.

Highlights at Art Basel include new photographic works and LED sculptures by **Chen Wei**. *Illusion of Transparency* (2024) shows a pile of diamonds sitting atop a cold marble slab in a bank teller's booth, unforeseeable as to what will be received in exchange. Simulating faulty LED signs in the city, Chen's LED sculpture *Trouble City #250103* (2025) is a pentagonal structure flowing hypnotically with glitches, streaks, and abstracted slogans.




Featured in the booth is Asleep (2024), a video portrait of Sin Wai Kin's blond bombastic drag persona, V Sin. The living and breathing image, Asleep, shows V Sin donning platinum high hair, curly eyelashes, voluptuous breasts, and starry night eye lids. The hype-femme bombshell is reminiscent of mid-century technicolor Hollywood pinups, conceived by the artist to reexamine their relationship with Western femininity.

Other highlights include Isaac Chong Wai's Falling Reversely—Collective Fall I (2023), a set of twelve photographs showing sequential images of performers of Asian descent falling in unison before standing in rewind, a statement against racial injustices committed against Asian diasporic individuals. This is part of Chong's multi-faceted project Falling Reversely (2021/2024), that was showcased in the Main Exhibition of the 60th Venice Biennale.

Trevor Yeung's Cuddle Party (Broken Bridge) (2025) is a shell sculpture enshrined in an oriental vitrine, the undulating forms of which echo the dynamics within human relationships. "Trevor Yeung: Courtyard of Attachments, Hong Kong in Venice" was presented as Hong Kong's Collateral Event at the 60th Venice Biennale; the return exhibition will be staged at M+ in 2025.

So Wing Po's sculpture *Some Kind of Day: Water* (2021) foregrounds hidden brass water pipe structures, with translucent ginger skin covering its openings illuminated from within. Water dripping sounds fill the atmosphere, projected



from within the pipes. Its structure mirrors that of ginger, with its fibrous and interconnected roots growing beneath our feet as rhizomes, demonstrating the resilience of systems that resists top-down forces, yet adapts, connects, and flourishes through cracks and fissures.

Hong Kong painter Yeung Tong Lung continues his 3-Fold series (2024-) in his latest work, subverting the normal viewing experience by the inversion of positive colors. Yeung's 18-panel painting 360°+ (2021-2023) is currently on view at the 11th Asia Pacific Triennial of Contemporary Art in Brisbane, until 27 April 2025. Concurrently, the group exhibition "One Square Water Soil" in SHOWCASE, Hong Kong Art Development Concil, will spotlight a group of paintings from Yeung's 3-Fold series.



Other highlights in the booth include the most recent works by artists Un Cheng, Chihoi, Yooyun Yang, Zhang Wenzhi, and Zheng Haozhong.

In addition, Jen Liu's *Pink Slime Caesar Shift: Electropore* (2021-2022) will be screening at <u>Art Basel's Film program</u>, curated by Para Site. In this pink surreal simulation, Liu explores issues around labor injustices and exploitations.
